Ballet Virginia will open its doors in early November thanks to the hard work of Michael Zarpas of Global Real Estate Investment who structured the deal, and of Richard Levin who owns the building and is offering it to Ballet Virginia at a below market rate. We are building a state of the art dance facility designed to be a safe, creative, and family-oriented facility where dancers of all ages and levels can obtain the training needed to achieve their goals. The facility will consist of three studios, a backstage dressing room, Loft Study Area, Sewing Room, Kitchen, and offices. The Loft Studio will be designed to simulate backstage quick changes and stage spacing. It will offer an abundance of natural light and plenty of room to dance. Designed with sprung floors and the latest technology, "our studios will be a choreographer's dream" said Suzanne Lownsbury Long, Director of Ballet Virginia International, "perfect for in studio dress rehearsals!"

The Ballet Virginia International faculty consists of eight professional instructors with combined experience of over 100 years in dance instruction, staging, choreography, and performance opportunities.
